1. **source** (noun) A **source** is the start or cause of something.
*Example: The mountain lake was the **source** of the river.*
2. **glide** (verb) To **glide** is to move smoothly and quietly, as if without effort.
*Example: The figure skater **glides** on the ice with grace.*
3. **invent** (verb) To **invent** is to think of and make something that has never been made before by anyone.
*Example: Alexander Graham Bell **invented** the telephone, and Martin Cooper created the first mobile phone.*
4. **capture** (verb) To **capture** something is to trap or take control of it.
*Example: The filter **captured** all the waste from the water.*
5. **produce** (verb) To **produce** is to cause something new to come into the world or to make something.
*Example: Our factory **produces** one hundred new cars a day for consumers to buy.*
6. **convert** (verb) To **convert** is to change into a different form or state.
*Example: I **converted** my old bedroom into an office.*
7. **determine** (verb) To **determine** is to find out the facts about something.
*Example: After reviewing the data, the team **determined** that the project was feasible.*
8. **renewable** (adjective) Something that is **renewable** continues to exist or is able to grow again and is therefore never used up.
*Example: Bamboo trees are highly **renewable** resources because they grow fast.*
